Alexandria, VA. -(April 8, 2021) The Alexandria City School Board voted to replace the names of several schools that were intrinsically linked to Alexandria's racist past. Acacia Lodge #32 was privileged to attend and support the historical renaming of Matthew Maury Elementary School to Naomi L. Brooks Elementary School. In a poll taken by the Alexandria School Board, the proposed school name of Naomi L. Brooks Elementary School gained exponential popularity among Alexandria, Va residents and was unanimously adopted as the official name change, to take place on July 1, 2021.

An Alexandria native Naomi Lewis Brooks (April 14, 1934- May 21, 2020) was a member of the Quander and Lewis families. She earned a masters degree from Virginia State University in Elementary Education. She held many teaching positions in the 25 years as an educator. Naomi Brooks is the wife of RWPGD Leo Brooks, USA, Brigadier General (Retired) who served on the Most Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Virginia's Board of Directors and Worshipful Past Master of Acacia Lodge #32, and the mother of Worshipful Past Master Vincent Brooks, USA, General (Retired) of Acacia Lodge #32.



Around the District-Spotlighting the Brothers

Worshipful Grand Historian McArthur Myers of Universal Lodge #1 has received many awards and special recognition, during his 69 years of life, too many to name here. Here is a little bit of WGH Myers Masonic journey; he received his Masonic Light in 2012 with the Universal Lodge, #1 Alexandria, Virginia. He served as it's 174th Worshipful Master during the Masonic year of 2018-2019. WGH Myers was appointed as the Grand Historian for the Most Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Virginia on December 1, 2018. WGH Myers is a long-time member of the Alexandria Society for the Preservation Black History. WGH Myers has been actively engaged with the City of Alexandria as a City Manager and Special Monitor overseeing the Fort Ward African American Cemetery. WGH Myers has been instrumental in advocating for and placement of eight (8) Historical Markers, resulting in the Alexandria City Council approving \$82,500 for the design, fabrication, and installation of African American Heritage Waterfront Trail (AAHWT) signage. WGH Myers recently was awarded the Ben Brennan Archaeological Award for his work in persevering Alexandria's African American History. Currently he's serves on the Equal Justice Initiative Project. A Project to Memorialize the two lynching's of African American men in the 1899. Most recently as a member of the Committee to development the Alexandria, Virginia African American Heritage Trial, WGH Myers was present to lay the first markets identifying the historical trail along the Alexandria waterfront. Finally, because of his hard work and commitment, WGH Myers was recently inducted into 2020 Alexandria, Virginia Living Legend Group.



Our History

Prince Hall Mason Shares Tales of the Montfort Point Marines Brother WPM Carroll Braxton #292

During the early stages of World War II, the U.S. Marine Corps, for the first time in its history, allowed African-Americans to serve within its ranks. But they were not sent to traditional boot camps of Parris Island, South Carolina or San Diego, California. Instead, African-American Marines were segregated and completed basic training at Montford Point, a facility at Camp Lejeune, North Carolina. Many of these Marines would be among the first African-American Marines to experience combat during the Battle of Saipan, in 1944.

Brother WPM Carroll Braxton has been recognized for his continued service to the fraternity and time as a Montford Point marine. WPM Braxton, a Master Gunnery Sgt., a World War II veteran and a Montford Point Marine is a native of Manassas, Virginia, and enlisted in the Marine Corps with several friends in June 1943. Approximately 20,000 African-American recruits received training at Montford Point Camp during World War II.

WPM Braxton recounted his time at Montford Point and recalled President Roosevelt once came and delivered a short speech, stating "One afternoon, we were called outside and this long convertible came along," said Braxton. "You know who it was? It was President Roosevelt. He said, 'Gentlemen I've got a short speech to give you. You have broken every record that the Marine Corps has ever set, and as far as I'm concerned, you're just as good as any Marine who puts on that uniform."

In June 2012, a Congressional Gold Medal was awarded to the Montford Point Marines in recognition of their personal sacrifice and service to their country during World War II.


