

I am eternally grateful to have this opportunity to compose a statement in our magnificent publication styled the Bee Hive. On September 16, 2023, you elected me to lead this grand Jurisdiction. I considered this to be an honor and privilege that you elected me to serve this MWPHGL of Virginia.

Thanks to your tireless effort, the MWPHGL of Virginia is on the move again. Together, we have made significant progress.

When asked to write an article for the Bee Hive with emphasis on expanding on my theme "Commitment to Leadership, Scholarship", I initially thought this might be a heavy lift. After a lot of thinking and a great deal of prayer, this theme is a culmination of my life experiences. My childhood, my education, my parental guidance to include my grandparents who always encouraged me to remember the —Golden Rule" and never forgetting the United States Marine Corps Moto, —Do or Die".

Leadership has been a part of my life as far as I can recall. My Dad instilled in me, and my brothers, —be your own man, think for yourself, never allow others to think for you and <u>Always Keep the Good Lord First</u>." With those encouraging beliefs, I always start the day with positive energy and thoughts. Together we will continue to raise the standards of our Grand Lodge and continue to project our progress advancing.

When I assumed the position as the 82nd MWGM, I asked myself several questions. What are my short-term goals, my mid-term and my long-term goals and how do I go about accomplishing them. With the understanding the one thing all Grand Masters have in common, none have never been a Grand Master before. With that said, I reached back on my past and current leadership experiences...Leadership.—Leadership is a process of self-development. No one can teach you how to lead; you need to be willing and able to learn how to lead. Mostly, we learn from our experiences and facing adversity. Stepping outside of the spaces where we feel safe — is a powerful teacher."

Here are several qualities I view for successful Leadership.

- 1. **Authenticity**: Being genuine and true to who you are, is fundamental to success in any role. You must embody your best self—the version that's not only highly effective but also capable of motivating and inspiring those around you. —Your competence is not enough; people need to trust your character and connect with you, otherwise they will not be willing to take risks with you.
- 2. **Curiosity**: It's about looking around the corner, exploring uncharted territories, and trying to understand the art of the possible. Great leaders have an —outside-in" perspective of their organizations and teams. This means they have an ability to look at situations and issues from the standpoint of external stakeholders, such as customers or competitors. This helps me make more informed decisions because they consider the broader context, beyond just internal organizational dynamics.

 3. Analytical prowess: Leadership requires the ability to break down complex problems, identify their root causes, and come up with fresh solutions. Trusting your gut will not suffice. Instead, you need to develop your analytical skills by focusing on cause-and-effect relationships and being attentive to patterns and trends.
- 4. **Adaptability**: The world is changing faster than it used to in part because of emerging technology and artificial intelligence. As a result, —participant expectations are evolving faster and you, as a leader, need to be able to adjust to these ever-shifting demands... **Fellowship.**
- 5. **Creativity**: Any idea that is new and useful to the organization is creativity. —Some of those ideas are incremental and others are breakthroughs." The most innovative ideas often emerge from the —adjacent possible," or the range of possibilities immediately within reach. Diversity of thought is the driving force behind true innovation, as each of us brings our own unique perspective and —slice of genius" to the table. So, encourage and promote diverse perspectives in your lodge and embrace the concept of learning from failure...**Scholarship.**
- 6. **Resilience**: Charging ahead with unwavering vision can spell trouble in today's dynamic and competitive business environment. Successful leaders recognize the fluid nature of situations and strive to understand the cultural context within which they operate. Most important, they exhibit the resilience to recalibrate if they're veering off course. You need to know how to regroup and get input from others by asking, _Is there another path, how to build your resilience.' Taking on an assignment without a clear definition of success is unsettling...**Scholarship.**
- 7. **Empathy:** Understanding and connecting with others on an emotional level is a key trait of strong leadership. Leaders must foster relationships, build trust, and actively engage with their team members. You need to be able to step into the shoes of your team members, understand what matters to them, what their priorities are, and identify common ground. Developing your emotional intelligence gives you a deeper appreciation of the complex challenges others are working through, and helps you foster a more supportive and nurturing environment.

Understand, if you accept the call to leadership, you must be willing to be misunderstood, criticized, opposed, accused, and even rejected.

November 5, 2024 is Election Day in the United States. This is the annual day for general elections of federal public officials. It is statutorily set by the U.S. government as the Tuesday next after the first Monday in November, the Tuesday that occurs within November 2 to November 8.

It was not until the 15th Amendment was passed in 1869 that black men were allowed to vote. But even so, many would-be voters faced artificial hurdles like poll taxes, literacy tests, and other measures meant to discourage them from exercising their voting right. This would continue until the 24th Amendment in 1964, which eliminated the poll tax, and the Voting Rights Act of 1965, which ended Jim Crow laws. Women were denied the right to vote until 1920, when the long efforts of the women's suffrage movement resulted in the 19th Amendment.

With these amendments removing the previous barriers to voting (particularly sex and race), theoretically all-American citizens over the age of 21 could vote by the mid-1960s. Later, in 1971, the American voting age was lowered to 18, building on the idea that if a person was old enough to serve their country in the military, they should be allowed to vote. With these constitutional amendments and legislation like the Voting Rights Act of 1965, the struggle for widespread voting rights evolved from the Founding Fathers' era to the late 20th century.

Why YOUR Vote Matters: If you ever think that just one vote in a sea of millions cannot make much of a difference, consider some of the closest elections in U.S. history.

In 2000, Al Gore narrowly lost the Electoral College vote to George W. Bush. The election came down to a recount in Florida, where Bush had won the popular vote by such a small margin that it triggered an automatic recount and a Supreme Court case (*Bush v. Gore*). In the end, Bush won Florida by 0.009 percent of the votes cast in the state, or 537 votes. Had 600 more pro-Gore voters gone to the polls in Florida that November, there may have been an entirely different president from 2000–2008.

More recently, Donald Trump defeated Hillary Clinton in 2016 by securing a close Electoral College win. Although the election did not come down to a handful of votes in one state, Trump's votes in the Electoral College decided a tight race. Clinton had won the national popular vote by nearly three million votes, but the concentration of Trump voters in key districts in —swing" states like Wisconsin, Pennsylvania, and Michigan helped seal enough electoral votes to win the presidency.

Your vote may not directly elect the president, but if your vote joins enough others in your voting district or county, your vote undoubtedly matters when it comes to electoral results. Most states have a —winner take all" system where the popular vote winner gets the state's electoral votes. There are also local and state elections

(Continued from page 4) to consider. While presidential or other national elections usually get a significant voter turnout, local elections are typically decided by a much smaller group of voters.

How You Can Make Your Voice Be Heard: Be informed! Read up on political issues (both local and national) and figure out where you stand. Get out and talk to people. <u>JUST GO VOTE"!</u>

On December 9, 1872, Lieutenant Governor Pinckney Benton Stewart Pinchback of Louisiana was appointed as the first African American governor of a state in the United States of America. P. B. S. Pinchback replaced Governor Henry C. Warmoth who was impeached as governor of Louisiana.

Voting proved the difference, in the election of an African American to this distinguished position. At the 2024 Dillwyn School of Instruction, Most Worshipful Grand Master Beverly W. —Butch" Morgan, Jr. #298 stated to the brothers that he had seen a CNN news broadcast the previous morning of an African American female from South Carolina who expressed displeasure of the economy and believed African Americans should not vote in the 2024 November Presidential Elections. Recognizing how a former NFL player had —skl himself as a puppet senatorial candidate", he pointed out the importance that Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. struggled and died for these voting rights for a better America for everyone.

As a former NAACP branch president for over nine years and as a voting rights advocate for over 25 years, I fought for voter registration, as well as for restoration of individual voting rights. I recall a voter registration event in Richmond where I literally ran out of restoration of voter rights forms. That is the situation of our disenfranchised African Americans, even today. Let us not be mis-educated in believing that our communities are not interested in participating in being a part of this great democratic process.

Neither Governor Pinchback nor the first elected Governor L. Douglas Wilder would have been elevated to the office of a United States governor, if we had not been active participants in these election procedures. People, we must do our part to not only GET OUT AND VOTE, but we also need to encourage others, to do the same.

Our need to execute this right to vote should not be minimized in order to promote this great country where our ancestors have come treading in the path through the blood of the slaughtered. We are strong in believing the God of our weary years, of our silent tears continue to lead us into the light. Let us prosper on their strength in order that we may forever stand TRUE to our GOD and TRUE to our Native Land.














Northern Virginia School of Instruction



Kilmarnock – The Most Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Virginia continues our most intense real estate investment development. Completing the exterior of the fourth and fifth cabin on the property, Project Manager MWPGM Larry D. Christian #253 found time to pursue and relay detail construction with the contractors.

As you recall, the Kilmarnock Project began when WPM William L. Lee of Palestine Lodge #100 approached the Grand Lodge through MWPGM Christian for help in savaging their Lodge on two acres in Lancaster County. Brother Christian who was Grand Master at the time promised WPM Lee that the Grand Lodge Board of Directors would work with Palestine Lodge #100 to save the property. After making financial arrangements with the bank, the Grand Lodge assumed the loan which is now paid off. The bottom floor of the Lodge is rented to out for weddings, Church affairs and other similar events. MWPGM Christian instituted a program that cost each member of the Grand Lodge \$49.00, which prevented the Grand Lodge from having to borrow the funds and each member of the Grand Lodge is now a share holder in the Investment of the property.

Recognizing the opportunity to expand the Kilmarnock investment, the Grand Lodge purchased an additional 30 acres from Mrs. Brenda Campbell in 2010. After the Grand Lodge delegates approved the Grand Directors plan to develop the property, the construction of the first cabin began.

In May of 2024, both Most Worshipful Grand Master Beverly W. —Butch" Morgan, Jr. #298 and the committee were briefed on the progress by the contractors.

In 2024, we expect to complete our project. Our project manager and the Grand Lodge Board of Directors will continue to keep the Grand Master and the brothers informed of the progress and welcome your input at the Grand Lodge Session. At your leisure, find the opportunity to visit the site.








Our RW Grand Lecturer of the East, Jose R. Ortiz

Brother Ervin Hutchings, Sr. - His POW Story



Martinsville - One may find him chatting with friends at the Exxon gas station at the intersection of Rt. 58 and Robin Rd. or a brother may find him on the second Saturday night at Sandy Level Lodge #274 or dining on a seafood dinner with his wife, Wilmath, at Captain Tom's Seafood in Martinsville, but you won't find him rocking in a chair at home. The semi retired truck driver, grandfather and community activist finds little time to sit idle.

Although Brother Ervin G. Hutchings, Sr. #274 is now thousands of miles away from the rice fields of Viet Nam where his active military career came to an abrupt halt, he continues as a community standout. Recalling the events of that humid day in 1969 in the South Asian country, Brother Hutchings does not shy away from speaking about the details.

Growing up as the sixth child in a family of four boys and four girls, he believed in finding his future, if one worked hard. While he tried employment at the Dan River Cotton Mill, then at Smith & Douglas Fertilizer, he found his calling when he was drafted into the Army in 1969. Gaining his basic training, he then went on to Fort

Benning and began airborne training. As a proven paratrooper and tactical weapons personnel, his desires to be stationed in

Germany changed when he was assigned as a door gunner on a helicopter in Viet Nam.

During a less than routine mission to which he was assigned, the helicopter he was on was hit and lost the rear tail propeller and the chopper spun uncontrollably to the ground. As identified when survivors are shot down behind enemy lines, they are classified as MIA's and POW's. United States recovery forces were able to locate him and his fellow crew members, and shuffled them back to the nearest United States installation. He was then transferred to a military facility in Oakland, California for a full recovery. Receiving a Purple Heart for his actions and injuries, he was offered an opportunity for an honorable discharge – he accepted.

Following his discharge, Brother Hutchings gained his CDL and began a career as a long distant truck driver and raised his family of four children with seven grandchildren and one great child and one great on the way. Brother Hutchings extends a positive outlook on life as he continues to support his church, his Veterans Post and his lodge in order that other individuals may be as prosperous as he has been.





A Moment in our History

History of Shiloh Lodge

Located in the Historic City Point District at the intersection of Prince Henry and Maplewood Streets, Shiloh Lodge overlooks the scenic Appomattox River. The lodge has had an interesting and colorful history in the annuals of Prince Hall Freemasonry in Virginia since it was chartered in 1876 with the Most Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Virginia Free & Accepted Masons, Inc. Celebrating 147 years in 2024; the lodge is only one year younger than the MWPHGL of VA.

The present building in which we held meetings has timber and other artifacts within its walls that date back some 276 years. The historical records show Shiloh Lodge hall was at one time the headquarters for the Federal Quartermaster General of the United States Army, during the Civil War.

The organization made at least one attempt to find a proper building location prior to settling on the current site. Minutes from a meeting in January 1877 indicate that the lodge brought a lot from a Mr. Palmer for \$50.00 with a \$25.00 down payment. After finding out that the lodge could not be built on this location, they sold it to Mr. William Green who paid the Temperance Lodge back the \$25.00 down payment and arranged payments to Mr. Palmer for the lot.

Minutes from a later meeting which are still on file in the archives of the lodge hall, show that our present building's history goes back to the date of October 22,

1877. Members of the lodge entered into an agreement to purchase the property and building from Brother A. Donan, a member and trustee of Shiloh Lodge. With a committee composed of brothers E. D. Bland, Edward Ellis, W. H. Harrison, Rev. Henry Jones, and Rev. William M. Moody, they were empowered to represent the lodge in negotiating for the purchase of the land and property, consisting of one (1) house and several lots, for a total sum of \$1,000.00. A down payment was made in cash of \$250.00 and a balance of \$750.00 was paid over a two year period. The minutes of that meeting reflected that the total sum of \$1,000.00 was paid in full on January 1, 1878. In

October of 1976, the Hopewell City Point Heritage Festival designated Shiloh Lodge as — The City Point House" and made it a part of the historical heritage of the nation.

Some of Virginia's outstanding and illustrious Prince Hall Masons have served as members of this historical lodge. They have made outstanding contributions during their years of service. They have also contributed in many fields of endeavors. In recognizing a few, Brother **E. D. Bland** where a district in the county of Prince George was named after his family members, Brother **George Gilliam** was the first African American boat captain to operate a ship plying its trade up and down the James River, Brother **Arthur Jackson**, **Sr.** was an outstanding business, civil, and religious leader, Brother **J. H. Lamb** was one of our nation's outstanding African American educators in the early 1920's and late 1930's and one time principal of the African American school in Hopewell, Brother **James W. Spencer** was a surveyor, engineer for highway construction, crane operator, a steam and electrical engineer for E. I. DuPont in Hopewell during World War I located at Firestone, one of the chief engineers for the construction of interstate highways in New York, Ohio, and

Pennsylvania and retired from the Youngstown Ohio steel mills, Brother **Bernard Epps, Sr.**, was an outstanding educator in the Hopewell school system in the 1960's and 70's, Brother **Ray C. Edmonds** (pictured left was raised in 1954, still



supports the lodge today) was the first African American Hopewell councilman and first African American vice mayor, the late WPM Rev. Dr. Curtis Harris, Sr. (pictured right was the first African American mayor of Hopewell and nationally noted civil rights activist and Brother Bossie B. Simmons (pictured upper right) is the only Shiloh member in the lodge's history to have held the honor of serving in the position of Most Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Master of Virginia from 1970 to 1972.

Due to a decline in membership and financial support, the lodge members elected to sell the lodge building in 2019 to the City of Hopewell. The City then partnered, in October 2023, with the National Park Service for a grant application to restore the building to its original status. According to a May 1, 2024 press release, the City of Hopewell received a

\$750,000 grant from the National Park Service for the preservation of Shiloh Lodge as a historical structure.

Shiloh Lodge #33 now meets at the Petersburg Masonic Temple, along with the other 12th Masonic District lodges.

In closing, we want you to know that the members of Shiloh Lodge #33 are children of GOD, traveling on the pathway of time, through a life that leads to eternity. Like all children of the KING, we are striving to teach by precepts and examples, that you should labor for a better world and in order to do this, we stress for you the concepts of brotherhood, sisterhood, Christianity, and love for all mankind.








Grand Chapter School of Instruction in the East
